

## **Exhibitors Policy**

**(Revised Jan 2009)**

The goal of *Jesus to the Nations* is to celebrate what God is doing around the world and to challenge Christians with the opportunities for international ministry. We are particularly interested in groups that send Canadian Christians to minister overseas in evangelism, church planting, and training local leaders. We also have an interest in groups that support local Christians in these ministries.

We welcome exhibits that further these goals. The following are some of the criteria we apply in deciding on the suitability of an exhibit.

- All exhibitors must be in agreement with the doctrinal statement of Jesus to the Nations.
- Exhibitors should be not-for-profit organizations.
- Exhibits should emphasize Christian work outside Canada. Being part of an international group is not sufficient to meet this requirement. The exhibit must be primarily international. Groups working chiefly with internationals within Canada may also be accepted.
- While our chief interests are in evangelism, church planting, and training, humanitarian groups in sympathy with these purposes will be considered on an individual basis.
- Bible Schools and Seminaries that have mission's courses and encourage an interest in missions are welcome as exhibitors.
- Having been present at a previous Jesus to the Nations conference or another Missions Fest does not guarantee acceptance. Exhibitors that do not meet the requirements will not be allowed to return.
- Groups that do not fully meet these requirements may apply. They will be placed on a waiting list and considered for acceptance if space is available one month before the date of the conference.

### **Exhibitors are expected to follow certain rules of conduct.**

- Exhibitors may sell books and audio/video materials that advance the understanding of missions.
- Exhibits must not exceed the allotted space and so interfere with other exhibitors. Tables and other display material must be kept close enough to the wall that they do not impede the flow of pedestrian traffic or obscure neighbouring exhibits.
- There are many ways to carry out the work of missions. Exhibitors should stress their own work and not criticize the methods of other groups.
- Noise can be a problem in our rather restricted display space. Exhibitors who use audio/visual presentations should keep the volume very low. No musical instruments may be used.
